SUMMARY: (S) SOUTH AFRICAN PRESIDENT ((MANDELA)) IS PRESSURING THE CHINESE TO SUPPORT HIS APPEAL FOR SANCTIONS AGAINST NIGERIA. CHINESE OFFICIALS ARE PERPLEXED BECAUSE CHINA HAS ECONOMIC TIES IN

BOTH COUNTRIES, BUT HAS MORE AT STAKE IN SOUTH AFRICA. THE CHINESE

AMBASSADOR TO NIGERIA WAS RECALLED FOR DISCUSSIONS ON THE ISS UE.

TEXT: 1.-(S)-IN MID-DECEMBER 1995 THE CHINESE AMBASSADOR TO NIGERIA WAS RECALLED TO BEIJING FOR CONSULTATIONS REGARDING THE PRESSURE CHINESE OFFICIALS ARE FEELING FROM SOUTH AFRICAN PRESIDENT

NELSON ((MANDELA)). CHINESE OFFICIALS ARE CONCERNED THAT SOUTH AFRICA WILL PRESSURE BEIJING TO SUPPORT INTERNATIONAL MILITARY AND

ECONOMIC SANCTIONS AGAINST NIGERIA, AND FEAR THAT MANDELA WILL THREATEN CHINESE INTERESTS IN SOUTH AFRICA UNLESS BEIJING BACKS SOUTH AFRICA'S CALL FOR SANCTIONS AGAINST THE NIGERIAN MILITARY GOVERNMENT. ALSO IN MID-DECEMBER 1995, BEIJING ORDERED ITS DIPLOMATS IN NIGERIA TO MAINTAIN A LOW PROFILE AND REFRAIN FROM MAKING ANY STATEMENTS THAT MIGHT IMPLY CHINESE SUPPORT FOR THE MILITARY GOVERNMENT.
